Raupunga Te Huki Marae

With our builder Fred Niblett having other work commitments in Wellington, no work has been done this month at the marae. He will return Easter weekend. We hope to make a start on the landscaping next week.

Marae Connectivity Project

The marae has been wired and ready for Wi-Fi connection and will be all go once the power has been connected to the marae.

Mohaka Marae

The outside panels to our 'Round Hall', Rongomaiwahine, are finally finished, one more coat of paint and its done, the 'Round Hall' looks beautiful. The next working bee will be to start the walls on the inside of the Rongomawahine.
