1. PURPOSE

1.1 This report provides information for the Economic Development Committee on Council and community activities. No decisions are required by the Economic Development Committee at this stage.

SUMMARY OF ACTIVITIES

2. NGĀTI KAHUNGUNU REGIONAL KAPA HAKA COMPETITION 2018

Wairoa hosted the 2018 Ngāti Kahungunu Regional Kapa Haka competition on April 21 at Wairoa's Lambton Square. Council wishes to acknowledge in particular Wairoa's two local teams, Te Rerenga Kotuku who placed first and Matangirau who place third, and who also qualify to compete in the national finals to be hosted in Wellington next year.

Given the potential economic benefit to the Wairoa district as a result of the event, preliminary analysis was undertaken following the event to quantify economic benefit. Methodology included surveys and one-to-one conversations with businesses and others. The impact of the event on Wairoa district businesses (including Marine Parade businesses – which mostly did not see a positive impact based on preliminary feedback), restaurants, supermarket, accommodation providers, gas stations, marae etc, was in the range of \$112,000 - \$115,000. This range excludes stall holders at the actual event which included a combination of local and out of town vendors. In speaking with local vendors, feedback was generally positive. This was also dependant on what kind of food that was sold (i.e. multiple vendors had the same food) and the position the vendor had with their stall at the event. Generally, feedback on the event has been overwhelmingly positive.

3. CULTURAL TOURISM SYMPOSIUM

The Cultural Tourism Symposium held earlier this year in February was the first step to engaging with the Wairoa community about identifying their future aspirations for tourism across the District. The aim was to 'plant the seed' to nurture and grow cultural tourism in Wairoa and identify what capability and capacity is required to ensure that it is sustainable and successful. There were approximately 60-70 people throughout the day. A series of strategic planning sessions will be hosted within each cluster area to identify aspirations, action plans

and capacity building to achieve success. Acknowledgements certainly to Hawke's Bay Maori Tourism who added value to the Symposium by sponsoring \$2000.00 towards the logistics and catering for the event. Te Puni Kokiri and Ministry of Social Development are key stakeholders with the next steps in the planning and action process. These sessions will be facilitated between May – July 2018.

5. GREAT THINGS GROW HERE WAIROA BRAND CHAMPIONS EVENT

Wairoa hosted a Great Things Grow Here (GTGH) Brand Champions event on April 5. Great things Grow Here is part of a regional brand programme and the Brand Champions is Hawke's Bay's fastest growing business network. Each Hawke's Bay Council subscribes to the programme for the benefit of Hawke's Bay businesses. The recent GTGH Brand Champions event demonstrated that Wairoa businesses are all very interested in networking, coming together, sharing their stories and supporting each other to be stronger, contribute and add value to a Hawke's Bay brand and improve what they do.

The event hosted more than 60 individuals from a range of local businesses. All costs for the event - \$1,426.72 were covered by the GTGH programme. Following the success of this networking event, Wairoa will look to host another networking event in approximately three months. Guest speakers might well include local MP and Minister for Small Business, Stuart Nash and potentially three Brand Champions, to share their stories.

6. EAST COAST FARMING EXPO

Council again supported the East Coast Farming Expo which was hosted in mid-April, in particular, Council sponsored an industry evening the night before the expo began (April 10). This was an opportunity for Council to welcome exhibitors and to also celebrate the innovations that are occurring in the farming industry.

7. WAIROA MĀORI FILM FESTIVAL (QUEEN'S BIRTHDAY WEEKEND – 1-3 JUNE)

Council will once again support the Wairoa Māori Film Festival which will take place on Queen's Birthday weekend, 1-3 June, in particular, the Awards Evening hosted at the Gaiety Theatre on Saturday 2 June.

8. MATARIKI REDS GOVERNANCE ARRANGEMENTS

Matariki – the Hawke's Bay Regional Economic Development Strategy (REDS) Governance arrangements have now been finalised following a review. The confirmed governance will consist of representatives from the five Hawke's Bay Councils and representatives from five of Hawke's Bay's Post Settlement Governance Entities (PSGEs).

9. KAHUTIA ACCORD

Two community meetings/workshops have been hosted in Wairoa to discuss the potential benefits of the Kahutia Accord. The Kahutia Accord is a tree planting programme lead by Ngāti Kahungunu lwi Incorporated and seeks to work with local land owners to look at opportunities to utilise land within the district. Information sessions have included a combination of local stories and information for regional advisors as they relate to carbon credits, the development of nurseries, land utilisation, current practice and programmes already underway within Wairoa. Discussion are ongoing as they relate to the Kahutia Accord.

10. CONNECTING TAIRAWHITI

As part of the Tairawhiti Economic Development Action Plan – an investigation phase to look at improvements to State Highway 2 to improve transport connections (from Opotiki to Napier – including Wairoa) is underway. Wairoa hosted a workshop on the 10th of April. Item 6.3 of the Tairawhiti Economic Development Action Plan states;

• 6.3 Upgrade SH2 inter-regional connections from Bay of Plenty through Tairāwhiti down to Hawkes Bay for horticulture and tourism.
