8 GENERAL ITEMS

8.1 UPDATE ON WDC STORMWATER INFRASTRUCTURE

COMMITTEE RESOLUTION 2024/31

The Pouwhakarae - Hua Pumau | Group Manager Assets & Infrastructure RECOMMENDS that Committee receive the report.

CARRIED

The Group Manager – Assets and Infrastructure noted that the team are working with Katarina Kawana and the work that she is doing around surrounding waterways that connects to the reserves.

Members discussed the replacement of a stormwater system on Grey Street and due to this work already being completed prior to the report being tabled, that any future replacement or upgrade work carried out by the Council be tabled earlier for the Board. It was noted that the Grey Street upgrade was an emergency works project therefore was due in a timely manner.

Cr Kaimoana noted including 3 kahui – Tapokorau Whanui, Mai Tawhiti and Hinemanuhiri when considering a name for the Waikorohiko Stream. Members agreed for the Tātau Tātau representatives sitting at the table to take it back to Tātau Tātau to include the Kahui as part of this work.

Matt Tong – DOC Operations Manager for Tairawhiti East Coast

Mr Tong briefly introduced his role and provided a general update on what DOC are currently working on in the Wairoa district. He noted the focus areas particular to Wairoa being:

- Morere Hot Springs Septic system replacement and hot water pipe replacement.
- Steering group working alongside the 2 kahui Rakaipaaka and Rongomaiwahine and looking at what the re-opening looks like, due to re-open in Spring 2024 and what the future holds for ownership of the hot springs.
- Previous annual work programme around the Ngamotu wetland where traps, weed control and re-vegetation work of native species was done, however, noting that this work was completed around 2019.

He noted the potential for future reporting from DOC to provide support to the Board on the

below:

- Wetlands around Whakaki and Opoutama.
- Technical expertise in biodiversity and on request from the Board can provide that support to relevant reserves that the Board monitors.
- Reporting around Rangihoua and Ngamotu reserves.
- Reporting from Helen Jonas around the marine mammals stranding in the district.
- Moving forward with a plan for the Board and DOC to work together.

8.2 HBRC MAORI RELATIONSHIP MANAGER REPORT

Mr Heath provided updates to previous actions raised from the Boards previous meeting highlighting the below:

- HBRC are working with Pryde Contractors to move the Wairoa river bar.
- Rookery around Ngamotu and liasing with whanau when working on that part of the beach.
- Spoken to Naomi Wilson about Okaka Urupa and the loss of vegetation and tree plantings.
 He noted that he has reached out for short-term funding for the issue however it is clear
 that the work required around Okaka is more than just planting that is needed for a viable
 longer term solution.
- Proposed wananga about the issues at Ngamotu and to talk about the future of the reserve and what can be done collectively to best protect the reserve.
- Organising an engineer working on the erosion at Rangihoua to attend a future Board meeting to discuss the issue in-depth.
- Wairoa river bar management review currently being undertaken to look into what can be done moving forward.
- Previous support from DOC in providing traps and weed control, however, no ongoing support over a period of time.

Mr Heyder advised that the pill boxes needed a clean up.

The Chair, Cr Eaglesome-Karekare suggested looking at the Whangawehi catchment group and how the Board can replicate this and apply it to the preservation of the Boards reserves. The suggestion was made for the Board to view this in person in Spring this year.

Mr Beattie noted concerns from what has been presented from Andrew Newman's Cyclone Gabrielle report in regard to the lower end of the river catchment, volume of silt and how that affects the river and bar management. He was advised that the Ruakituri catchment group is the only headwater structure and entity at this time with Nuhaka also making progress in this space.

Ms McIlroy joined the meeting at 10:40am via zoom. Cr Roslyn Thomas left the meeting at 10:46am via zoom.
